The purpose of the course is to provide the students with an introduction to the legal rules relating to business activities, with a particular emphasis on limitations and directions following from legislation and how, in practice, the business can adapt to these. Course structure

The course is based on a total of 36 teaching hours of lectures and 6 hours of interactive exercises. Students are required to purchase and bring with them the required study aids to the lectures and to acquaint themselves with

these through the study of various topics. In particular, knowledge relating to legal rules dealt with in the textbooks or discussed in lectures is required. Teaching through lectures requires that students prepare for these in advance. The lectures will focus on themes that are known to cause problems. Parts of the syllabus will have to be studied independently.

Evaluation

A three-hour written examination concludes the course. In particular, the examination paper will test whether the candidate is able to apply legal rules to practical problems related to compulsory literature and reference books.
