Objective

The main purpose of this course is to provide the students with an insight into what is perceived as particularly Scandinavian with reference to management and work conditions. This implies that national culture and cultural differences will be emphasized. Theories on culture and cross-cultural management will serve as the basis for a more in-depth discussion of Scandinavian management. The so called "Scandinavian Model" will serve as a point of departure.
